

## SoftSync's Personal Newsletter V1.3

These 4 D64 images make up the **Personal Newsletter V1.3** release from SoftSync, Inc.

### Disk 1 - Newsletter V1.3 contains:

**Import** - moves graphics files such as digitized art or Commodore graphics files into geoPaint

**Scraper** - creates a file that can be directly loaded into a photo album without using geoPaint

**Convert** - import graphics from Print Shop clip art disks (above descriptions from March 1988 **RUN** Magazine Pg 67)

**NEWSLETTER** - the newsletter program

**V1.3ReadMe** - this geoWrite file

**Read Me** - a Personal Newsletter sample file that explains which files to copy to a work disk to view the samples

**Photo Phinish** - a Personal Newsletter sample file that shows inclusion of graphics

**Text** - another Personal Newsletter sample file that mixes fonts and graphics

**Form** - another Personal Newsletter sample file that explains font usage

**PERSONAL** - a V1.0 Photo Album file

[Make sure you have the PERSONAL Photo Album from this disk, plus the 5 fonts (California, Cory, Dwinelle, Roma, University) from the original GEOS disks, on the work disk when you open any of these sample files].

### Disk 2 - Clip Art

contains the following V1.0 Photo Album files:

**Business, Miscellaneous, PERSONAL4, BUSINESS4, Misc4**

### Disk 3 - Clip Art Vol. II

contains the following V1.0 Photo Album files:

**Personal2, Business2, MISC2**

### Disk 4 - Clip Art Vol III

contains the following V1.0 Photo Album files:

**PERSONAL3, BUSINESS3, MISC3**

The filenames ending in 4 were not part of the original release. The reason these files were created was that V2.1 of the Photo Manager can't handle more than 60 photos in an Album and many of these Albums had far more than 60 (Personal3 had 83). Rather than people having to search for a V1.0 Photo Manager I used Rick Coleman's Photo Mover 3.0 to move pictures from the original filename[1-3] to filename4 in order to reduce the former to 58 photos if they originally had more than 60.

Personal, Personal2, Personal3, Business, Business2, Misc2, and Misc3 were all reduced.

Now all the Photo Albums, which are V1.0, can be opened by Photo Manager V2.1 and the albums will be converted to V2.1 format meaning the photos can have names attached to them.

Another interesting thing about Personal Newsletter and Photo Albums is that photos are inserted into a document without going through the Photo Manager/Photo Scrap process. This means that the same Photo Album you got the photos out of needs to be on the disk when you work on a document. If you have a different album on the disk when you open a document the photos will be different as the document links to Photo(#) in an Album and doesn't include the actual Photo Scrap. Perhaps consider creating a Photo Album to go with each project.
